



Conjure the Chaos Art Competition Rules and Regulations

For Teachers and Students

In a world consumed by screens and fleeting digital distractions, local entrepreneur and martial arts master David Nemeroff is bringing art and community back into the real world—one card at a time.

His upcoming project, “Conjure the Chaos,” is more than just a new card game. It’s a movement to reconnect people, revitalize in-person gatherings, and give local high school art students the opportunity of a lifetime: to have their original artwork featured in a commercially produced game, permanently.

As part of the launch, Nemeroff is organizing an art contest across local high schools, inviting students to submit original illustrations inspired by the world of “Conjure the Chaos.” Selected winners will receive a copy of their work printed on a playable card—complete with artist credit—introducing their first official piece of published art to the world. We hope to have the game available in time for holidays!

How to Enter the 2025 Conjure the Chaos Art Competition

1. Review the 2025 Rules & Regulations for Students and Teachers.
2. Complete the 2025 Student Art Submission Form and Return to Your Art Teacher with a Photo of Your Art before October 31, 2025.

2025 Art Competition Rules & Regulations

The rules and regulations included here apply to the Conjure the Chaos Art Competition

The competition is open to artists who can submit one or more pieces of handcrafted artwork with the following themes:

- Wizards, mystics and/or sorcerers
- Vampires
- Dwarves
- Shaman

- Magical spells or effects for cards like “Warping Explosion,” “Mirror Smash,” and “Arcane Overload.”.

The original artwork must be two-dimensional and can be made in any medium, such as paintings, drawings, collages, prints, mixed media. Your original art piece should be full-color, horizontal orientation, with background elements (no blank backgrounds please) and the size being either 8"x10" or 8.5"x11"

The Artwork must be the creation of a single student. Students may not collaborate on an entry. Any computer generative software, including artificial intelligence (AI), may not be used in the creation of the artwork. Students should only submit new artwork created solely for this competition and not artwork previously created and used or will need to be used for other purposes. While it is not the intent to censor any artwork, we do wish to avoid artwork that is potentially inappropriate for display, such as artwork that might be sensationalistic or gruesome.

To submit, please provide only one high resolution digital photo of each piece of art that you are entering into the competition. Include your full name and school name in the title of each digital photo file. Provide your photo(s) to your art teacher along with a completed Student Art Submission form before the deadline. If you are chosen as a winner, you will then submit the original art piece.

Original Requirement

An original work is different from what others have created. Each entry must be original in concept, design, and execution and may not violate U.S. copyright laws. We understand artists may reference other creators and popular culture to create their art, but every work submitted to this competition must be substantially different from any source material. Any entry copied from an existing creation made by someone other than the student is a violation of the competition rules and will not be accepted. We reserve the right to withdraw any award distinction.

Student Art Submission Form

A Student Art Submission Form must be submitted by the deadline. This form contains a certification that the artwork is original in design and execution and legal agreements. The student and a parent or guardian must sign where appropriate. Illegible or incomplete forms will not be accepted. Please retain a copy for your records.

The Winners



Selected winners will receive a copy of their work printed on a playable card—complete with artist credit—introducing their first official piece of published art to the world. The art will be displayed on the Conjure the Chaos website and social media, along with a photo and a biography of the artist (if they like). One grand prize winner will receive a \$100.00 check. No other consideration will be offered.

All adjudication is anonymous. Submissions are selected for awards without knowledge of the participant's gender, age, ethnicity, or hometown. We are looking for art that exemplifies originality, realism and how well it represents the style of the card game. Winners will be selected within 30 days of submission or less. Once winners are chosen, art teachers and students will be notified by email. Any digital photos of art submissions not chosen will be deleted.

We are excited for you to join us in the magical world of “Conjure the Chaos”. We hope to see your art in the Conjure Deck soon!
